

## **Rules for all volunteers and guests**

1. All power tools brought into the shed by volunteers must be in good condition and safe to use.
2. No-one should use power tools unless suitably experienced – if in doubt seek instruction/guidance.
3. No guards on power tools should be removed or tampered with.
4. No-one should alter or tamper with the electrical supply/wiring without permission from the committee.
5. No flammable materials may be stored in the shed other than paints and finishers in their proper containers.
6. Volunteers may store their own tools in the shed and use tools belonging to the shed but no member should use another volunteers tools without permission.
7. Tools to be used safely and for their designed purpose.
8. Volunteers may store materials for no more than two personal projects at a time in the shed, large projects will need permission from the committee where this will restrict the use of the shed by other volunteers.
9. All volunteers should put away tools and clean up when they have finished their work for the day.
10. All breakages, damages, accidents or injuries must be reported immediately.
11. No smoking or alcohol in the shed.
12. While it is called Men's Shed it is not a shed i.e. where you dump stuff and leave it a mess.
13. You are not the only one using the shed. Please think of others, respect for all is paramount and enables the shed to function in a harmonious way and provides a pleasant environment for all.
